3 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located http://beaversc.co.uk

5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the main flagpole. On the front lawn
- 5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in Race Signals AP. This changes race signals AP.
- 5.3 [DP] Flag D with one sound means boats shall not leave the shore until this signal is made. The warning signal will not be made before the scheduled time or less than XX minutes after flag D is displayed.

7 CLASS FLAGS

RS300 RS300 Class Flag or if not available Numeral 3

9 COURSES

- 9.1 Courses to be sailed will be Windward Leeward or Trapezoid. The diagrams in Addendum A show the courses, the order in which marks are to be passed and the side on which each mark is to be passed.
- 9.2 The courses to be sailed will be indicated by boards on the side of the committee signal vessel.

10 MARKS

Marks 1, 1A, 4S and 4P will be orange buoys The start mark will be a small green buoy adjacent the staring boat, the finish mark will be a small red buoy adjacent the finishing boat.
